

Econometrics

Organizational behavior is the study of thoughts, feelings, and behaviors of people in organized settings. These settings may be entities (firms, but also public administration units or other entities) or also associations, voluntary groups, networks or markets. Some of the fundamental processes to understand this are motivation, personality, attitudes, groups and group processes, and leadership. Those constructs are fundamental for understanding human behavior in any economic activity. In fact, some of the main constructs and tenets of the behavioral tradition - such as identity, regret, heuristics, satisfaction and happiness - are now being increasingly incorporated into studies of finance, accounting and economics. Participants will be provided with a reading list for each of the topics. The list will include an overview of the topic (usually a chapter from Tosi and Pilati Managing Organizational Behavior, (forthcoming Elgar Press) and research articles of the quality and substance that participants should fully understand as they are exemplars of “publishable research” that participants should seek to produce in their career.
