Some European movements favour ostracism as a reaction to a period of social and economic uncertainty.

To avoid repeating the mistakes of the past **E-WORDS** addresses young European citizens, especially students, to provide them with a sound understanding of the historical and political processes which led to the rise of **totalitarianism** in 20th century Europe (Nazi-Fascism in Western Europe, Communism in Eastern Europe) and the subsequent ostracism of many citizens.

- the development of a European identity based on the recognition of common roots, diversity and shared values, in order to make young European citizens ready for a participatory democracy.
- the reflection and debate on European cultural diversity and common values to promote peace, reconciliation, respect, through an innovative analysis of key words.

To this purpose **E-WORDS** organises different activities:

- webinars to facilitate the debate on the key words
- seminars to share testimonies from former political prisoners
- school students performances
- young people drawings
- film projections
- round tables
- debates on how to fight racism against minorities groups
