



Guidelines for students in the biomedical and medical area valid since May 3rd, 2021

The teaching activity in the programs of the biomedical and medical area will be held in several complexes in order to reduce the circulation of people in the Teaching Complex Le Scotte.

LECTURES

• Access to the classrooms:

- Access to the Teaching Complex must take place from the entrance located on Strada delle Scotte 14, where a thermoscanner will detect body temperature.
- Wear the surgical or the FFP2 filtering mask, covering nose and mouth, before entering and keep your mask all the time inside the premises. If you do not have a mask, pick up one available at the entrance.
- It is mandatory to frequently sanitize hands for at least 30 seconds with the alcoholbased gel available at all facilities.
- o In classrooms, occupy only the free seats not indicated by the ban sign.
- Avoid changing seats during and between lectures.
- o In the presence of several people, try to maintain the minimum safety distance (at least 1 meter) respecting the appropriate signs and/or free seats.
- Do not leave clothing and personal items unattended.

• Common areas:

- o Avoid gatherings, in classrooms, corridors and other common areas.
- Study stations are arranged along the corridors which students can use following hand sanitization, respecting the rules on interpersonal distancing and wearing personal protective equipment. The area will be controlled by security guards.

• Other:

- Please use the canteen of San Miniato for lunches and dinners.
- Please use the study rooms available at the San Miniato complex and library. The library at the Le Scotte Complex will be closed.
- Except for those who have to carry out internships, students attending in-presence lectures should not enter the hospital.





INTERNSIPS

Access to hospitals:

- Access to the hospital is allowed only for the time necessary to carry out the internship.
- Only students who have been vaccinated (or registered for a soon-to-receive vaccination) will be allowed to start their internship. Those who are not vaccinated or are not registered for receiving it will not be admitted to the internship, which will be subsequently rescheduled with a consequent delay in completing the study program.
- Each trainee is required to undergo swabs on a weekly basis or according to a different frequency established by the Health Surveillance of the AOU Senese.
- During the entire period of stay within the department, each trainee is required to wear the protective equipment provided, that will be made available in the department.
- The respect of safety distances and frequent hand sanitation remain essential elements.
