Philip McDonagh is Adjunct Professor and Director of the Centre for Religion, Human Values, and International Relations at Dublin City University. In the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs, Philip worked on the Good Friday (Belfast) Agreement and in several international frameworks (EU, UN, OSCE) and developed a strong interest in the intersection of religion and diplomacy as Ambassador to India, Russia, and the Holy See. He has published poetry and plays and written extensively on religion, poetry, and the public sphere. He is Distinguished Global Fellow at the Center of Theological Inquiry (Princeton) and a member of the Advisory Council of the Institute for Economics and Peace (Sydney); the Steering Committee of the OSCE Academic Network (Hamburg); and the Advisory Council of the Institute for Integrated Transitions (Barcelona). Philip is co-author of the recent book On the Significance of Religion for Global Diplomacy (Routledge 2021)
